This ARNG MOS Medical Retention Board (MMRB) Process is applicable for all ARNG T32 M-Day Soldiers referred to an MMRB. The process exists to ensure continuity of efforts among Soldiers, Units, States, and the MMRB board regarding recommendations for the Soldier's ability or inability to physically perform duties required of the Soldier's MOS in a worldwide field environment because of injury, illness, or disease.
