

Dental Readiness for Title 10/Title 32 ARNG Soldiers Process: Obtaining dental treatment for Title 10/Title 32 AGR Soldier

Description

M-day Soldiers may receive dental care at no personal cost whether it is directed as part of a military medical exam or at the Soldiers' request. Soldiers will contact their Unit Readiness Non-commissioned Officer (NCO) for this process. The Unit Readiness NCO will obtain authorization from the Deputy State Surgeon (DSS) for the Soldier to seek care and treatment from either a government dentist or a contract provider.

Soldiers may elect to receive dental care and treatment from an alternative provider but cost will be at the Soldiers' expense and not entitled to reimbursement from the ARNG channels.

Soldiers receiving care from a provider authorized by the DSS will receive a classification of 1, 2, or 3. Class 1 and 2 will have their paperwork processed by the attending provider. Class 3 will be given instructions to contact their unit to garner authorization for additional care from the DSS.

Systems

Army Dental Digital Repository (ADDR)

The Army Dental Digital Repository (ADDR) is a system designed to integrate dental data collected from Army AC dental treatment facilities, Army RC dental readiness programs using DENCLASS, and Army AC mobilization platforms.

[Army Knowledge Online \(AKO\)](#)

The Army Knowledge Online (AKO) is a web-based application and primary component of the Army Enterprise Portal designed to enable knowledge sharing among Army communities and improve decision dominance by commanders and business stewards in the battle space, organizations, and Army's mission processes.

Army Selected Reserve Dental Readiness System (ASDRS)

The Army Selected Reserve Dental Readiness System (ASDRS) is an application designed to track dental readiness outside of alert status and remind soldiers about upcoming dental appointments.

The Corporate Dental Application (CDA) is a system designed to capture data and function as a reporting system that permits the Army to measure the dental readiness status of Reserve Component (RC) Soldiers reporting to mobilization platforms.

[Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System \(DEERS\)](#)

DEERS is a database that maintains personnel and benefits information for Active, retired, and reserve uniformed service personnel, eligible family members of active, retired, and reserve uniformed service personnel, DoD civil service personnel and DoD contractors requiring logical access.

[Dental Classification System \(DENCLASS\)](#)

The DENCLASS module is a system designed to standardize the count of dental classifications, eliminate duplicate data system entry, facilitate the dental exam workflow, standardize the documentation of the health history and record of dental exam and integrate dental readiness within the Medical Operational Data Systems (MODS) architecture.

[Medical Protection System \(MEDPROS\)](#)

The Medical Protection System (MEDPROS) is designed to track immunization, medical readiness, and deployability data for all Active and Reserve components of the Army as well as DA Civilians, contractors and others.

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
