

Dental Readiness for Title 32/M-day Soldiers Process: Obtaining dental care as a Title 32/M-day Soldier

Description

Title 32/M-day Soldiers may be entitled to receive dental care at no personal cost whether it is directed as part of a military medical exam or the Soldiers' request. The Soldier will request dental care from their Unit Readiness Non-commissioned Officer (NCO), and may be granted authorization to utilize either a government dentist or a contract provider. It is essential Title 32/M-Day Soldiers continuously maintain their dental health at a Dental Fitness Classification (DFC) 1 or 2 in order to meet deployment standards and avoid an examination/treatment at the mobilization station. Soldiers are encouraged to seek care at the first signs of a dental problem.

Systems

Army Dental Digital Repository (ADDR)

The Army Dental Digital Repository (ADDR), hosted by the Army AC, integrates dental data collected from Army AC dental treatment facilities, Army RC dental readiness programs using DENCLASS, and Army AC mobilization platforms.

[Army Knowledge Online \(AKO\)](#)

The Army Knowledge Online (AKO) is a web-based application and primary component of the Army Enterprise Portal designed to enable knowledge sharing among Army communities and improve decision dominance by commanders and business stewards in the battle space, organizations, and Army's mission processes.

[Corporate Dental Application \(CDA\)](#)

The Corporate Dental Application (CDA) is a system designed to capture data and function as a reporting system that permits the Army to measure the dental readiness status of Reserve Component (RC) Soldiers reporting to mobilization platforms.

[Dental Classification System \(DENCLASS\)](#)

The DENCLASS module is a system designed to standardize the count of dental classifications, eliminate duplicate data system entry, facilitate the dental exam workflow, standardize the documentation of the health history and record of dental exam and integrate dental readiness within the Medical Operational Data Systems (MODS) architecture.

[Medical Protection System \(MEDPROS\)](#)

The Medical Protection System (MEDPROS) is designed to track immunization, medical readiness, and deployability data for all Active and Reserve components of the Army as well as DA Civilians, contractors and others.
