Eligibility for MAR2, PDES or NLOD Process: The process for determining Soldier eligibility for MAR2, PDES or NLOD processing (Military Occupational Specialty (MOS) Administration Retention Review, Physical Disability Evaluation System, or Non-Line of Duty)

Description

This process ensures Soldiers are referred to the appropriate administrative or medical board. An example of an administrative board would be the Military Occupational Specialty (MOS) Administration Retention Review (MAR2). An example of a medical board would be the Physical Disability Evaluation System. This process is applicable to all ARNG T32 M-Day Soldiers with an injury, illness or disease whether incurred in the line of duty or not.


[Line of Duty \(LOD\) Module](#)

The Line of Duty (LOD) Module provides a web-accessible comprehensive, user-friendly tool for use by HR Specialists regardless of location and the National Guard Bureau to administer and manage LOD determinations, incapacitation pay, medical care, and safety programs. It documents injuries that occur in the line of duty whether they are considered informal or need formal investigation depending on the details. The system provides real-time tracking of all cases from initial draft to approval. Improved security is provided by the capability to digitally sign specified data elements using a Common Access Card (CAC).

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Note: The numbers on this process map are for reference purposes only and do not denote the sequence of the process

12	Select retirement if eligible	Option 2: Soldier elects retirement if eligible.				
13	Select Non-Duty (ND) Physical Evaluation Board (PEB) process for fitness determination only	Option 3: Soldier can request a Non-Duty Physical Evaluation Board (ND PEB) for a fitness determination only. This is not a determination of eligibility for disability benefits. The HSS is the POC for the Soldier if requesting a ND PEB. If the PEB finds the Soldier fit for duty, Soldier is returned to duty with an amended profile. Soldiers found unfit for duty are discharged/separated or retired, if eligible.	AR 600-60
