SUBJECT: (All States Log Number I92-0385) Army Medical
Department Center and School 91C Training Programs

1. References: AR 40-3, AR 40-501, AR 600-9, AR 600-110,
NGR 350-1, NGR 351-1.
2. Purpose: To provide information on the AMEDDC&S 91C
Practical Nurse Program, for ARNG units wishing to train their
91Cs at Fort Sam Houston.
3. Facts:
 - a. The Active Component is on line with licensing of 91Cs.
Army National Guard Practical Nurses, IAW DoDI 6025.6, All
States Log Letter P90-0067, and P92-0028, must be licensed by
October 1993, to remain MOS qualified.
 - b. Graduates from the AMEDDC&S 91C programs receive the
military occupational specialty (MOS) upon separation from
initial active duty training (IADT). Supporting documents are
DD Form 214 and the AMEDDC&S diploma. These soldiers are MOS
qualified however they must also obtain a State or Commonwealth
LPN/LVN/RN license as per NGR 351-1, to retain 91C MOS.
 - c. ARNG soldiers reporting to Fort Sam Houston for 91C
training will usually be enrolled in the St. Phillips Program
(Educational Service Agreement [ESA]). However, there is a
chance they will be assigned to a class at the AMEDDC&S 91C
program.
 - d. Soldiers attending the AMEDDC&S program will spend six
weeks at the AMEDDC&S for Phase I. When Phase I is completed,
soldiers will move to the Phase II training sites. Phase II
assignments will be made by the course director during Phase I.
Attendance at Phase II will be at an Active Army post nearest
the soldiers home/unit in the training cycle.
 - e. Soldiers attending Phase I at Fort Sam Houston are not
entitled a permanent change of station (PCS) move. When
soldiers proceed to Phase II a PCS is authorized, active duty
for training orders should authorize PCS to Phase II.

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f. Soldiers attending St. Phillips college will be at Fort Sam Houston for the full length of the course and are entitled to a PCS move.

g. Soldiers who are scheduled to attend 91C at the AMEDDC&S or the St. Phillips ESA program must hold an MOS in the 91 CMF.

4. Prerequisites for 91C20 St. Phillips ESA Training Program.

a. Minimum aptitude area score of 95 (ST).

b. Meet service remaining requirements.

c. Meet qualifying academic test scores.

d. Be IAW AR 600-9.

5. The following information must be turned in during inprocessing:

a. Medical and dental records.

b. Finance and personnel records.

c. Physical examination (current to within 1 year) to include a current HIV test IAW AR 600-110, and CVS if applicable (2 copies).

d. Shot records (2 copies) (must have MMR, TD current within 10 years and negative IPPD current within 1 year of course start date.

e. Qualifying NELSON-DENNY test scores (2 copies).

f. At least one of the following-qualifying ACT, SAT, ASSET, or PRE-TASP scores (2 copies). Soldiers will not be tested at Fort Sam Houston!

g. Official academic transcripts (1 copy).

h. Letters of recommendation (2 copies).

i. Current CPR certificate card (original and 2 copies).

j. 2a and 2-1 (1 copy each).

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6. Revised minimum scholastic scores:

7. Soldiers must have the minimum qualifying scores on the NELSON-DENNY test and one of the other tests listed. Soldiers will not be tested at Ft Sam Houston. Soldiers not meeting the prerequisites will be returned to their units immediately. This is necessary due to the minimum passing scores at St. Phillips which are 77 percent. Units will submit qualifying test scores 90 days prior of the class start date to: Commander, AMEDDC&S, ATTN: ESA LIAISON (HSHA-MN), Fort Sam Houston, TX 78234-6100.

8. Special Information:

a. Students should report to Bldg 922, Company D, 187th Medical Battalion, AMEDDC&S, by 1500 on their reporting date in BDU (bring all uniforms, including duty whites). To help offset expenses one months advance pay is recommended.

9. Post graduate soldiers should take the NCLEX-PN exam in their home state at the first opportunity to facilitate licensure.
