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Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC)

Process: Ensuring the next of kin (NOK) is aware of and, if eligible, receives DIC benefit

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Description

DIC is a monthly benefit paid to eligible survivors of certain deceased Soldiers and Retirees. Eligible survivors include unmarried surviving spouses, unmarried children under 18 or 23 if enrolled in higher education, disabled children, and low-income parents. The DIC benefit amount varies depending on the survivor.



2	Status of NOK?	<p>If the NOK is a surviving spouse, they are eligible if (s)he:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Validly married the Veteran before January 1, 1957 - Was married to a Soldier who died on active duty - Married the Veteran within 15 years of discharge from the period of military service in which the disease/injury that caused the death began or was aggravated - Was married to the Veteran for at least one year - Had a child with the Veteran - Cohabited with the Veteran continuously until the death, or if separated, was not at fault for the separation - Is not currently married <p>If the NOK is a surviving child(ren), they are eligible if (s)he is unmarried and under age 18 (or the ages 18-23 and attending school).</p> <p>If the parents of the casualty are in financial need, they also receive DIC payment. 9	Receive DIC payment	NOK receives a monthly DIC payment. The amount of payment differs based on the number of children and the need of aid.				An additional \$250 is paid to the surviving spouse with minor children for the first two years or until the last minor child is removed from the DIC benefit should that happen before the two years of eligibility is over.
