Description

If a Soldier dies as a result of a military training accident, operational accident, or friendly fire, an investigator is appointed to conduct a collateral investigation into the accident. Casualty and Mortuary Affairs Operation Center (CMAOC) provides information on the Fatal Training/Operational Accident Program to the CAO. This program is mandated by the Army Chief of Staff.







2	Provide information on Fatal Training/Operational Accident Program	If killed in training or operational accident, CMAOC provides information on Fatal Training/Operational Accident Program to CAO. CMAOC contacts CAO within first week of the casualty.	AR 15-6 AR 600-34			This program is mandated by the Chief of Staff of the Army.
3	Receive information on Fatal Training/Operational Accident Program	CAO receives information on Fatal Training/Operational Accident Program from CMAOC.	AR 15-6 AR 600-34			
4	Provide update on collateral investigation	CAO provides NOK an update on collateral investigation. This may happen multiple times. CAO explains any delays and provides an estimate timeframe of when the investigation will be complete. This can be done in person or over the telephone.	AR 600-34			
5	Receive update on collateral investigation	NOK receives an update on collateral investigation by CAO. This may happen multiple times. This can be done in person or over the telephone.	AR 600-34			
6	Present investigation result options	CAO presents investigation result options to NOK. This is a formal offer in letter format to the NOK to determine if they would like to receive a personal presentation, a copy of the investigation report, and a copy of the autopsy report.	AR 600-34

12	Prepare well-being report	CAO prepares the well-being report. This report outlines basic information about the NOK including: their likes, dislikes, hobbies, children, grandchildren, current emotional state, religious preferences, any outstanding issues, and any other general observation. 15	Attend rehearsal presentation (CMAOC, CAO)	CMAOC, CAO, and the briefer attend a rehearsal of the presentation. The briefer is usually a Colonel or high in rank (first O6 in chain of command). 16	Attend presentation (CMAOC, CAO)	CMAOC, CAO, Chaplain, Family, and briefer attend the presentation. The location is determined by the Family, but is usually in the Family's home. Family can have anyone they wish to attend. Class A uniform is worn for the presentation. The average length of the presentation is two to two and half hours. 17	Receive redacted copy of investigation	If the Family declines to receive a personal presentation, CMAOC receives a redacted copy of the investigation via mail from the Unit Staff Judge Advocate explaining the redactions. 18	Send redacted copy of investigation	CMAOC sends redacted copy of investigation to CAO via mail. This package is double wrapped, the first wrapping is addressed to CAO, the send is addressed to the Family.	Army Casualty Notification and Assistance Guide

Line of Duty (LOD) Investigation report is requested from Army Human Resources Command (HRC), along with a copy of NOK's picture ID. Autopsy Report is requested from The Officer of Army Forces Medical Examiner, along with a copy of DD Form 1300 (Report of Casualty) and a copy of NOK's picture ID. CID Report is requested from U.S. Army Crime Records Center. Safely Investigation Report is requested from U.S. Army Combat Readiness Center.
