

Post 9/11 GI Bill (Chapter 33) Transferability Checklist

- 1. Qualifying active duty service**
Title 10 AD under section 688, 672 (d), 12301 (a), (d), or (g), 12302, or 12304 which must appear on your orders/DD214, or Title 32 AGR *with* an Honorable discharge (including ALL T32 AGR for WMD, CST, and State Counterdrug Coordinators), or Title 32 502(f) ADOS or ADSW with Operation "Noble Eagle" from 11 SEP 2001 – 31 MAY 2002. **NO OTHER Title 32 ADOS or ADSW duty qualifies.**
...since 9/11/01.
- 2. Amount of qualifying active duty service**
90 days – 36 months. This will determine the % of benefit you are entitled to.
- 3. Qualifications**
To be approved to transfer benefit/s, you must:
In addition to **at least** 90 days qualifying active duty service after 9/11/01...
- have completed at least six years of service in the Armed Forces, **and**
 - NOT have an adverse action flag, **and**
 - Agree to at least four years of service.
- 4. Career plans**
What are your career plans? You'll need to consider this in light of the service obligation associated with the transfer of benefit.
- 5. Determine remaining GI Bill entitlement**
In order to determine how many months of benefit you are entitled to transfer, you need to know how many months of GI Bill benefit you have already used. This will require contacting the Department of Veterans Affairs either through eBenefit or by calling them at 1.888.442.4551. You'll need to ask how many months of each bill you have used.
- 6. Education Plan**
What is **YOUR** education plan? What education do **YOU** need and how do you intend to pay for it? Does your current job or future job plans require another degree? If so, how will you pay for it?
- Finally,
- if you're going to transfer your benefit, you **MUST** do so before separation/retirement or you will lose the opportunity
 - if you're going to transfer the benefit, seriously consider the % level and what that will actually pay for.
