

Army Emergency Relief (AER) Process: Determining eligibility and receiving AER benefits

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Description

AER is a private, nonprofit organization available to Soldiers and their Families in the following categories: Soldiers on extended active duty and their dependents; members of the Army National Guard and the U.S. Army Reserve on continuous active duty for more than 30 days and their dependents (applies to Soldiers on AD for training (ADT) and serving under various sections of title 10, United States Code); Soldiers retired from active duty because of longevity or physical disability, or retired upon reaching age 60 (Reserve Components) and their dependents; and widows (ers) and orphans of Soldiers who died while on active duty or after they retired. AER provides help with emergency financial needs for: food, rent or utilities; emergency transportation and vehicle repair; funeral expenses; medical/dental expenses; personal needs when pay is delayed or stolen; give undergraduate-level education scholarships, based primarily on financial need, to children of Soldiers.



1	Eligible for AER?	<p>Soldier and/or Family member(s) may be eligible to receive support from AER. Assistance is based on emergency need, sustaining need, or special one-time need. The following are eligible to receive assistance:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Soldiers on extended active duty and their dependents - Members of the Reserve Components of the Army (National Guard under Title 10 authority and Army Reserve) who are on continuous active duty for more than 30 consecutive days and their eligible Family members - Soldiers retired from active duty because of longevity or physical disability or retired upon reaching age 60 (Reserve Components) and their eligible Family members - Widows, widowers, and orphans of Soldiers who died while on active duty or after retirement 	Army Emergency Relief Website			Dependents include: spouse, son, daughter, adopted children, and/or stepchildren.
2	Complete DA Form 1103	If eligible to receive AER, Soldier and/or Family member(s) completes DA Form 1103 (Application for Army Emergency Relief Financial Assistance).	Army Emergency Relief Website	DA Form 1103		
3	Locate military ID card	Soldier and/or Family member(s) locates their military ID card. Each dependent must have their own military ID card.	Army Emergency Relief Website			Dependents include: spouse, son, daughter, adopted children, and/or stepchildren.

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4	Casualty occurred?	If the Soldier is a casualty, the Casualty Assistance Officer (CAO) assists the Family members in applying and receiving AER benefits.				
5	Contact local AER office	<p>If the Soldier is a casualty, the CAO contacts local AER office or the AER headquarters located in Alexandria, VA stating the next of kin's (NOK) circumstances/financial situation and AER assistance is needed. Also, the CAO provides the following information:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Casualty's full name, SSN, grade, date of death, and cause of death (if known) - NOK's full name, SSN, date of birth, and address - Dependent(s) full name, age, and status <p>CAO schedules an appointment for the NOK with AER office.</p>	<p>AR 930-4</p> <p>Army Emergency Relief Website</p>			<p>Dependents include: spouse, son, daughter, adopted children, and/or stepchildren.</p> <p>Refer to the Army Emergency Relief Website – Locations for a complete list of AER locations.</p>
6	Accompany NOK to appointment	CAO accompanies the NOK and dependent(s), if applicable, to AER appointment.
